ESL Certificate / Endorsement

EDLA / WLAN 4633 Methods and Materials for Teaching Second Languages Instructional strategies and techniques associated with a proficiency based approach. Theoretical bases of language learning and acquisition, innovations in curricula, resources, materials, and technology.

EDLA / WLAN 4643 Second Language

Assessment Study of second language assessment techniques and procedures. Construction and critiques of instruments for assessing proficiencies in listening, speaking, reading, writing.

EDLA / WLAN 4653 Second Language Acquisition

Explores theories and research in the field of second language acquisition, with emphasis on the application of concepts to classroom instruction in language learning.

EDLA / WLAN 4663 Teaching People from Other

Cultures Study of concepts and strategies that help teachers employ culture and language of ESL students as vehicle for language acquisition.

ENG Comparative Modern Grammars Major grammatical systems traditional, structural, and transformational.

ENG 4083 Introduction to Linguistics Phonetics, phonemics, morphology, syntax, and semantics.

ILA 4836 Practicum in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages A focus on learner behavior, classroom dynamics, teacher/student interactions, techniques used in the ESL classroom, with emphasis shifting from theory to practice.
